Summer of Climate Justice Part 2:

1) The Diocese of Westminster has published a commitment to do its utmost to become carbon neutral by 2030 in its parishes and curial buildings. It has also expressed its commitment to working with schools to encourage them to follow the same path. The Diocesan plan focuses on 4 pillars:

- i) Clean Energy Sources – purchasing gas and electricity from green suppliers.
- ii) Investment Policy – promoting a path to decarbonisation.
- iii) Reducing Carbon Emissions - from energy usage in parishes and diocesan buildings.
- iv) Generating Clean Energy.

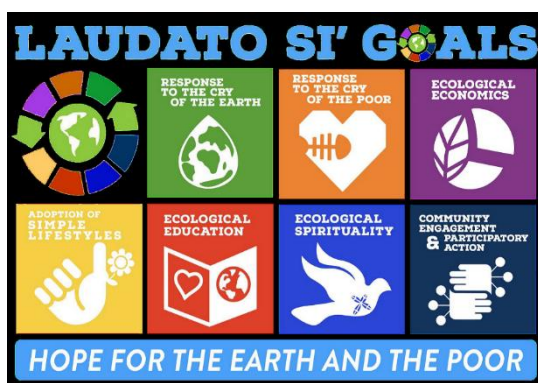
14th – 17th September: Pax Christi – DSEI Arms Fair in London. Action being planned.
